



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

In November of 2021 Meals On Wheels (Sudbury) marked 50 years serving the Greater Sudbury Community! We have reflected on how far our agency has come in 50 years. To mark this incredible milestone MPP Jamie West presented our agency with a Certificate of Recognition from the Provincial Parliament. Because in-person celebrations were still not viable due to the pandemic, we opted to host a "Party for Two" fundraiser, our first ever of this kind. This proved such a success, raising \$15 000 in a few weeks time, that planning is underway for this year's event. We continually



expand and grow from the pilot project of three months, five clients and meals prepared externally. We have seen our client base grow to over 600 clients and regularly surpass over 35 000 meals annually. Additional programs such as the Grocery Program and producing our own Hot Meal Replacements began in this past year. The Ontario Trillium Foundation brought this dream into reality with \$150 000 in funding to ensure we could purchase the necessary equipment and partially renovate our kitchen to produce these meals.

The focus this year was to ensure the Hot Meal Replacement (HMR) Program, more commonly known as our frozen meals went from dream to reality. We had some anticipated delays due to the global shipping issues faced by all organizations but prior to this fiscal year ending, our first HMRs were delivered to our clients. This coming year we will be in full scale production of our HMRs and building our inventory base to support this program. We look forward to growing this program in the coming year.

I am extremely proud of how Meals On Wheels (Sudbury) responded locally to the COVID-19 pandemic, ensuring our most vulnerable adults in our community were safe and fed. With another successful year we delivered 45,999 meals to 541 clients. 35, 685 were hot meals and 10 314 meals were hot meal replacements. This is an increase of 37% from 2019 prior to the pandemic. There were also 764 deliveries for groceries to clients. It is evident when looking at these numbers, the vital role that food plays and how Meals On Wheels (Sudbury) plays a significant part in this role to ensure food security to our clients.

Our staffs resilience to continue with the ongoing challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic to adapt and support our clients to ensure meals and groceries were received did not go unnoticed. We have an incredible administration team that ensure deliveries run smoothly, clients are registered and assessed, and volunteers are onboarded. We are fortunate to have amazing Transportation Clerks to assist with delivery of meals and groceries. The road conditions, the continual adaptions to ensure safe meal delivery does not stop these individuals from showing up

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every day to complete their assigned routes. Our kitchen staff cannot go unmentioned as without their devotion to ensuring our kitchen runs smoothly without interruption daily, our clients would not receive the nutritious, hot, quality meals produced.

We want to thank our exceptionally dedicated volunteers who have continued to be resilient over the last few years with so much change. Our volunteers are the reason for our success as they deliver food, friendship and the winning smiles (even through the masks) and for this we cannot measure the impact these deliveries have on our clients. Our volunteers are always there for our clients and our staff. We truly appreciate your hard work and commitment to Meals On Wheels. Driving 90 630 kms this past year an increase of 118% since 2019, clearly outlining the number of routes has expanded in the past two years to accommodate the growing need for those facing food insecurity. A special thank you to our Board of Directors for your leadership and advocacy in our community. You continue to help make us stronger. Thank you for your belief in me as the ED to continue to expand and grow our organization.

We are also grateful for the financial assistance Meals On Wheels (Sudbury) has received this past fiscal year. Thank you to our funders at Ontario Health, the government of Canada for our grocery program (transferred from the Ontario Community Support Association), the United Way Centraide North East, the Sudbury Food Bank, the J.C. MacIsaac Foundation, the Ontario Trillium Foundation, and the numerous individual donors. Your continued support allows us to provide the quality meals we do to our clients.

As the Executive Director, I am humbled by the dedication of such a small group of people to ensure our services are nothing but exemplary. I am incredibly proud to be a part of this team and look forward to the opportunities of 2022-23!

HOT MEAL REPLACEMENTS (HMR)

Our HMRs, more commonly known as frozen meals have moved from an external vendor to being prepared in our own kitchen this past year! We are now making flash frozen meals and building our inventory for our clients. This program allows clients to order meals for supper, the weekend or holidays when the agency is closed. These meals are still distributed in a two-week cycle.

I learned about Meals on Wheels when I was employed by the Ministry of Health. They were one of my programs that I financed. Less than a year after I retired, I realized I needed to find a place to do some volunteer work. Meals on Wheels came to mind immediately. I came in for an interview and started in May of 2008. 

GROCERY PROGRAM



This program allows eligible persons in the community to call or email in their grocery order. We work with local grocers to ensure orders can be completed and the orders can be charged to Meals On Wheels. Our dedicated volunteers attend these stores and complete the grocery order, delivering to our clients, all in our new format of contactless service. Over the past year we have provided 764 deliveries within our community and look forward to continuing the grocery service for our most vulnerable populations.



Your staff is great! It's a pleasure to deal with Donna, Paul, Jonah, and Tammi (she's phenomenal!).



Expenses


